STN Numbers

Membership Dues:

All members join through the high school they are attending. The annual membership year runs from July 1 through June 30. All Indiana DECA members pay \$5.00 for state dues and \$8.00 for DECA Inc. dues. District dues are determined separately. Please check with your district coordinator for that information. Online membership submission and dues are due to DECA Inc. by November 15, 2020. Additional members can be added USING the online system at any time during the school year but must be online and paid in full by March 1, 2021, to compete at the International Career Development Conference in April 2021.

DUES MUST BE PAID IN FULL BEFORE ANY STUDENT CAN COMPETE AT DISTRICT CDC, SCDC, AND ICDC.

Membership Frequently Asked Questions:

O: Who can be a DECA member?

A: DECA membership is available to students with career interests in marketing, entrepreneurship, finance, hospitality and management in grades nine through twelve. DECA membership is also open to advisors, alumni and professional members. Students who are in college may join collegiate DECA. All DECA members must register through an official local chapter, and each chartered association may have additional membership guidelines.

Q: Who should join DECA?

A: All students who participate in DECA activities at the local, district, chartered association and/or international levels should pay chartered association and DECA Inc. dues. These activities include, but are not limited to, conferences, competitive events, online challenges, scholarship applications and more. Board policy states that all members, including advisors, must pay membership dues.

Q: What are membership dues?

A: DECA Inc. membership dues are \$8 USD per person (student, advisor, alumni and professional) plus \$5 USD Indiana DECA association dues. The list of dues is available and automatically appears for each chartered association in the online membership system.

Q: What is included in DECA membership?

A: In addition to an official membership card and pin, DECA members have exclusive access to all of the college and career preparation opportunities DECA provides. These include four issues of the DECA Direct digital magazine, participation in DECA's Competitive Events Program to demonstrate their knowledge and earn recognition, opportunities to attend conferences designed to prepare them for college and careers, access to \$200,000 in scholarships and more. DECA membership is for one school year, culminating June 30 of each year.

Q: What is the deadline for submitting membership?

A: DECA membership is open year-round; however, DECA encourages all chapters to activate their chapter by submitting initial membership by November 15. This ensures that the chapter continues to receive communication, publications, and services from DECA Inc. The deadline for members to be eligible to compete at the International Career Development Conference is March 1.

What is the minimum number of members for a chapter?

A: The minimum chapter membership size is ten (10) student members and one (1) advisor (or any combination of 11 paid members). The only exception is in the case of a new or reactivated chapter, which has two years to obtain the minimum chapter size.

Can dues be refunded or transferred?

A: Membership dues (Indiana and DECA Inc.) are nontransferable and nonrefundable. Please read over your members' names carefully before submitting.


Many of my students use nicknames. Should their full name or nickname appear on the roster?

NOTE: If a district does not fill all the slots they are entitled to for SCDC, then the slots may be filled by a district that has eligible students who participated but who did not qualify in their district. This is to insure a full slate of contestants. There will be a minimum test score needed to be able to move on.

WRITTEN EVENT ALLOCATION: A chapter may submit a maximum of 8 entries per written project event with one exception: project management events are ONE per chapter per event. Please check your DECA Guide for the number of allowable participants for each event that has a written component.

ALLOCATIONS FOR DISTRICT SERIES AND TEAM **EVENTS:** The recommended guideline is one entry per every ten members in your chapter. However, please contact your district coordinator for allocations in your specific district.

Competitive Event Updates

- 1. Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, Team Decision Making Events will combine the 10-minute presentation and 5-minute judge questions period to 15 minutes for presentation and judge questions.
- 2. Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, the Virtual Business Challenge-Entrepreneurship (VBCEN) event will be added.
- 3. Beginning with the 2021 DECA International Career Development Conference, the format for the Virtual Business Challenge competition will change. For each track, all 16 teams will compete in two sessions, and the final ranking will be determined based on the cumulative score from both sessions.

- 4. Participants in the Business Solutions Project (PMBS) will upload their written entry electronically for ICDC as DECA pilots electronic written entry submission. Once DECA Inc. receives registration from the chartered association, DECA Inc. will email the chapter advisors with entries in PMBS with instruction on how to upload the written entry. This written entry will be the entry used to score during preliminary and final competition at ICDC.
- 5. There is no higher priority than the health, safety, and well-being of everyone involved in DECA's educational programs. Given the uncertain length of the current pandemic, DECA Inc. will monitor the coronavirus (COVID-19) situation closely and make any updates regarding our competitive events program at deca.org/compete and through e-mail communication to chapter advisors and chartered association advisors. As always, please contact your chartered association advisor regarding the administration of the competitive events program at your association and district levels.
